EXPLORE THE RESOURCES AT LAUNCESTON LIBRARIES

The Tasmanian Reference Collection is situated in Launceston Library has a treasure trove of goodies for those researching their family history in Tasmania. It is situated at 71 Civic Square, Launceston opposite the Post Office in St John Street. It is open during the following times:

Monday – Thursday 9.30am – 6.00pm

Friday

9.30am - 7.00pm

Saturday

9.30am - 2.30pm

Amongst their collection on the first floor you can

- 1. Access Tasmanian Names Index (online) which holds the following:
 - Convict permissions to marry (1829-1857). Convicts applying to marry free people or other convicts.
 - Convicts (1803-1893). Convicts transported to Tasmania and those convicted locally through the convict system.
 - Departures (1817-1867). People leaving Tasmanian ports, mainly Launceston.
 - Divorces (1861-1920). Petitions for divorce in the Tasmanian Supreme Court.
 - Inquests (1828-1930). Inquests into people's deaths.
 - Marriages (1803-1899). People who married in Tasmania.
 - Arrivals (19th Century). Passengers and ships arriving, mainly in Hobart. Contains surnames A-K, L-Z to be added.
 - Births (1803-1933). People born in Tasmania including some baptisms collected by the Registrar General (1900-1933 baptisms only).
 - Census (1837-1857). Householders in the 1840s and 1850s, not complete for all districts.
 - Deaths (1803-1933). People who died in Tasmania including some burial records collected by the Registrar General (1900-1933 burials only).
 - Health & Welfare (1830-1873). Patients and attendants at the New Norfolk Colonial Hospital and applications to the Queens Orphan School.
 - Hotels & Properties (1818-1958). Hotel licensees, inquests into fires, Launceston buildings and demolished hotels.
 - Miscellaneous (1838-1873). General correspondence of the Controller general of convicts and North Fleet shipwreck survivors.
 - Naturalisations (1835-1905). People applying to become citizens.
 - Prisoners (1895-1902). Prisoners in the Hobart gaol.
 - Wills (1824-1989). Wills and letters of administration of estates registered for probate.
 - WW1 Photographs (1914-1919). Photographs and articles from the Tasmanian Mail and Weekly Courier illustrated newspaper. * (* Data indexed by Wendy Knolle and kindly supplied by the Tasmanian Family History Society, Hobart Branch)

- 2. Search selected biography files
- 3. Search Assessment Rolls for various municipal areas in Tasmania
- 4. Search Electoral Rolls starting from 1856 to the most recent
- 5. View Land grant maps
- 6. Access Trove (*online*) where books, pictures, photos, journal articles, government gazettes, maps, diaries, letters, archives websites (1996-now) and information on selected people are held. The most valuable resource for family historians is their digitised newspaper collection which includes The Mercury (Hobart, 1860-1954), Examiner (Launceston, 1900-1954), Advocate (Burnie, 1890-1954), Daily Telegraph (Launceston, 1883-1928), Launceston Examiner (1842-1899), Tasmanian News (Hobart, 1883-1911), Daily Post (Hobart, 1908-1918), The North Western Advocate and the Emu Bay Times (1899-1919), Zeehan and Dundas Herald (1890-1922), The North West Post (Formby, 1887-1916) and many more.
- 7. View every Tasmanian newspaper ever published is available on microfilm or hard copy
- 8. Search Post Office Directories available online, in hard copy or on microfilm
- 9. Ask Launceston Library staff your land ownership queries
- 10. Explore The Times Digital Archive (England) 1785-2006
- 11. Explore British Historic Newspapers an English database
- 12. View Tasmanian Pioneer Index (BDM registrations) 1803-1899 and Tasmanian Federation Index (Births 1900-1919, D&M 1900-1930 (excellent resources as can search for children of a couple if know parents' names only)
- 13. Have free access to Ancestry.com and Findmypast through libraries computers
- 14. Visit http://www.libraries.tas.gov.au/family-history and find information on aboriginal ancestry, arrivals and departures, BDM, convict life, education, work, where someone lived, life as a child in care, court records, prison records, Royal Derwent Hospital, military records, guide to records, ancestors outside Tasmania and overseas, getting started and other useful resources. Also, at the top right hand of this homepage click the talking head tab and during LINC open hours you can chat live with a librarian who can assist you with your research!
- 15. Ask the very friendly and experienced staff at the Tasmanian Reference Collection at Launceston Library for help with your historical research. They are brilliant!
